Introduction to Badgerland Lacrosse Association

The goal is to conduct all our activities in a manner that will set an example of good sportsmanship and friendly competition for our young players.

Teams:

Youth Teams – 4 divisions – Must be at least a sophomore in high school to officiate and Level 1 certified

U14, U12, U10, U8

Expectations

- Get proper US Lacrosse Membership (\$55, \$35 if you are not an adult. Player membership counts, just need to add the Official category to your membership):
 - All new and returning officials must be members of US Lacrosse with the "official" membership classification for insurance and liability purposes. You should receive a 2019 NFHS Rule Book with your membership renewal.
 - o If you are a current US Lacrosse member as an official (expiration date 9/30/19), no action is required.
 - If you are a current US Lacrosse member, but not as an official, contact US Lacrosse at 410-235-6882 ext. 102 or at membership@uslacrosse.org to change your status. There is no additional fee for this.
 - o If you are not a US Lacrosse member, you must join as an official: go to www.uslacrosse.org/membership.
- Join the Wisconsin Lacrosse Officials Association (WILOA) \$45 is equal to one youth game fee, payment made at the first training class.
- Complete Level 1 and/or Level 2 classroom and on-field training.

- Minimum requirements for first year youth officials:
 - Striped, collared shirt (pocket preferable)
- o Whistle (FOX40) finger
- Yellow Flag
- o Black Shorts, no logos
 - o Black shoes, low socks
- Officials in their second year and beyond must also have a black hat with white piping; shorts must have belt loops, belt, a second flag.

The Season

- BLA games scheduled April and into June.
- Youth festivals may be scheduled after Memorial Day.
- We use ArbiterSports for officials scheduling. Request invitation to join if needed. Become familiar with it.
- Youth games are scheduled Saturdays and Sundays, typically.
- Advancement to high school games:
 - o First year adults with sports officiating experience may receive JV assignments later in the season, depending upon experience and skills advancement. Discuss with trainer/assigner.

Game Fees:

- U14, U12 and U10 2-man \$50
- U12 and U10 1-man \$75
- U8 1-man \$45
